International Training of Engineers

The evolution of the world requires that graduated engineers and project managers be able to be more efficient in collaboration with suppliers, customers and contractors within an international perspective. For this reason, the International Institute of Technology of Sfax, Tunisia, has asked Robert Laurini, after his book entitled "Training of engineers facing the challenges of globalization", published in April 2013 by Hermès-Lavoisier, Paris, to give a seminar on this topic on July 16, 2017.

Knowing that the lack of cultural understanding is the cause of the failure of 65% of the attempts of international collaboration², it is important that the university training of graduated engineers include this concern.

In front of about fifty participants, he addressed the cultural problems of design, based on the analogies with the design of the gardens.

In fact, each people has a mode of designing in its DNA: so, the French gardens and those of English or Chinese reveal the characters, the profound cultures and the ways of designing technological objects: the importance of the mathematical aspect for the French, of the beauty for the Italians, the precision for the Germans, the pragmatism for the English, the synthesis between the tradition and innovation for the Chinese; these are examples of some important cultural traits

that can lead to misunderstandings and even failures between engineers and project managers.

In addition, the problems of languages, academic exchanges, internships in foreign companies, practical training in the management of international projects have also been the subject of specific developments and analyses during this seminar



In other words, as the education of graduated engineers was, until the middle of the twentieth century only technology-centric, the business and project management issues were gradually included as well as the creation of enterprises. International openness is therefore a new pillar of their training.

USF-AWB is ready to help you in this direction to define your international training policy for engineers. ■

Compendium of Good Practices for international joint PhD's

In a previous issue of our quarterly newsletter (n ° 13, March 2014), we discussed this issue. In fact, a head of doctoral studies recently told us that almost all international joint PhD's had problems, often of a bureaucratic nature.

Many universities provide information on this type of training for PhD students, but hardly ever for supervisors who have to deal with bureaucrats whose requirements are often divergent.

Bearing all that in mind, USF-AWB has decided to draft a compendium of good practices for PhD supervisors. This will deal with the drafting of the agreements because the models proposed by some universities remain silent on many practical problems.

As examples, explanations were given facing

the change in the regulatory framework in one of the two countries, the change of responsibilities in the chains of responsibility, the choice of the language of writing, the practical organization of the defense, the methods of approval of the committees, the appointment of reviewers, modes of writing of the statements of defense, financing of the defense, organization of the cover, etc.

We ask those who have faced difficulties to contact us in order to explain the adopted solutions and possibly to include them into this future compendium.
