## Madagascar: The University of Toamasina identifies its priorities

A cooperation agreement was signed in July 2015 between USF-AWB¹ and the University of Toamasina. It is in this context that has hired a mission with the goal to identify the priority needs of University support from the different faculties and institutes of the University of Toamasina. Several meetings have taken place, Institute by Institute, Faculty by faculty, with all the deans for teaching and research. This has allowed to gather information on students by courses, the number of teachers, the research projects when they exist, projects of creation of new fields or specializations and missing facilities together with the desired support.

### **Support for university research**

Faculty staff at the University of Toamasina are highly variable in number from one Institute to another and a faculty to another but overall still very inadequate.



The University of Toamasina needs academic external support to help train competent staff being able to ensure supervision of the different sectors and specializations: assistants need mentorina to become associate professors and the associate professors to become full professors. The consequence is to help them to integrate into the world of research and to organize doctoral schools. It is important today to give priority

support to strengthen these PhD systems and in parallel to assist them has even to complete their academic qualifications

### **Employability of students**

The employability of students depends a lot on the links that are established between the professional and the academic world. This requires in particular the identification of the priority to meet the expectations of professional circles, of business forums, of association of professionals especially when teaching is very technical. This can be achieved especially by the organization of internships in companies and by lifelong training the professionals and alumni.

Support of USF-AWB is expected here to support the training systems of the University of Toamasina, and to strengthen them. ■

## Cooperation begins between USF-AWB and the University of Antananarivo (Madagascar)

Several exchanges and consultations have been made between USF-AWB and the University of Antananarivo officials with aim to identify the priority areas of cooperation.



Several meetings were held first at the initiative of the President of the University with members of the University Scientific Council, then with officials of faculties of the University.

As a result of these exchanges, proposals for collaborations have emerged with different faculties. These were intended to strengthen the supply of university education in specialties contributing especially to improve the employability of students.

Its mission is to train high level executives, to promote entrepreneurial initiatives and develop research management activities. in Collaborations between USF-AWB and INSCAE are organized to support specialized Masters and doctoral research collaboration initiated by INSCAE. ■

### Position in Civil Engineering and Surveying in Bhutan

Job Title: Adjunct Associate Lecturer/

Lecturer/Asst. Professor

Language of Instruction: English

**Job Description:** The position is for one or two semesters. Depending upon experience, the adjunct faculty member may be asked to conduct short term training courses for the JNEC faculty and stakeholders. The faculty member may be assigned to teach one or two of the following modules of Diploma in Surveying programme:

Feb - June 2017

i. Surveying Analysis and Adjustment

ii. Engineering Survey

iii. Cartography

iv. Land Development and Site Design

July - Dec 2017

i. Principles and Application of GIS

- ii. Principles and Application of GNSS

The position involves carrying out surveying field work practicums with students for 18 hours a week in rough terrain and in various weather conditions within campus. The adjunct faculty member will also be required to guide the students in their semester-long project work which usually takes place in the final semester. Additionally, the adjunct faculty member maybe be required to guide the students in a 6-week long survey camp which may be held within or outside the campus.

**Educational Qualifications:** Minimum: Bachelors in Surveying/Geomatics/ Geodesy/GIS/GPS;

Preferable: Masters or Doctorate (Ph.D.) in Surveying related field.

**Professional Experience:** Surveying related field, experience in GIS, GPS subject area will be an advantage. Teaching experience preferred; however good command of English language and subject matter most important. Research Experience: Preferred but not mandatory

#### **Start date and Duration:**

From 1st Feb 2017. One year or more preferred. Start date can be negotiated for the right candidate.

Jigme Namgyel Engineering College (JNEC), established in 1974 is one of the constituent colleges of the Royal University of Bhutan. The college, which was earlier known as Royal Bhutan Polytechnic started as a polytechnic with diploma programmes in Civil Engineering and Electrical Engineering which are still continued today. Additional programmes have been introduced since 2011, including a degree level programme: Bachelor of Engineering in Power Engineering which was officially launched by His Excellency Lyonchhen Tshering Tobgay, the Prime Minister of Bhutan in 2015. The college also got renamed as Jigme Namgyel Engineering College.

JNEC is located at approximately 890m above mean sea level on a picturesque lush green hill

located at the west-end of Dewathang town, 18 km north of Samdrup Jongkhar town in eastern part of the Kingdom of Bhutan. Samdrup Jongkhar town shares border with Assam, India and is approximately 40 km from the nearest railway station in India and approximately 120 km from the nearest international airport in Guwahati, Assam, India.
